Life of David

We've been learning about a person called David. Some of the lessons are:

- David Anointed
- David & Goliath
- David & Saul
- David & Jonathan
- David & God's Ark
- David & Mephibosheth

We'll be going through these topics again today to see how much you can remember ©


Note: The REVIEW can be in whatever format you feel is suitable for your age group.

Younger children: Can be matching game/story telling/acting out stories or craft with pictures of the lessons.

Older children: Can be in quiz format — choose a category and answer a question in that category. Group that answers the most number of questions wins.

For an added challenge, you can add in a Bingo variation: e.g. Print 2 of the 5x5 Bingo grids and paste on the wall. Divide class into 2 groups; one sheet for each group.

A representative from a group chooses a tile (e.g. A1) and answers the question in that category. If correct, that group gets a star in the corresponding A1 box on the grid. The aim is to try to get 5 stars in a row. Group that gets the most number of rows wins.







Some questions (of varying difficulty) for each of the past few lessons as below. You may come up with your own.

DAVID ANOINTED

- 1. What was David's job as a young boy? Shepherd tending the sheep
- 2. How many brothers did David have? 7
- 3. What was David's position among his siblings? The youngest
- 4. What was David's father's name? Jesse
- 5. When Samuel saw David's eldest brother was very tall and good looking, he thought this was the one God had chosen to be king. What did God say? People look at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart.
- 6. What did Samuel use to anoint David? A horn of oil

DAVID & GOLIATH

- 1. Who was Goliath? A tall and strong champion of the Philistine army; a giant
- 2. Why was David not afraid of Goliath? Because he knew that God was bigger than the giant; he knew that the battle is the Lord's
- 3. What did God do for David in the past when he was watching his sheep? Helped him to fight the lion and the bear
- 4. What did David bring to the field with Goliath? A slingshot and five stones
- 5. Where did David's stone hit Goliath? On his forehead
- 6. What did David use to kill Goliath once he had fallen down? David cut off Goliath's head with Goliath's own sword









DAVID & SAUL

 After killing Goliath, David became very successful and popular. Who didn't like him? Saul



- 2. Why did God reject Saul as king? Because Saul had no heart for God; Saul wanted to do things his way, not God's way.
- 3. What did the women of Israel say that made Saul jealous of David? Saul has killed thousands; David has killed tens of thousands.
- 4. What did Saul do when David was playing the harp for him? Throw a spear at him
- 5. What other ways did Saul try to kill David? By trying to get him killed in battle/by the Philistines
- 6. How many Philistines did Saul ask David to kill in exchange for marrying his daughter? 100
- 7. How many Philistines did David kill to marry Saul's daughter? 200
- 8. Who did David marry? Saul's daughter, Michal

DAVID & JONATHAN

- 1. Who was Jonathan? Saul's son; David's best friend; heir to the throne
- 2. David and Jonathan made a Covenant with each other. They exchanged their personal belongings. Name 2 items that they exchanged. *Robe, Tunic, Sword, Bow, Belt (any 2)*



- 3. What does a covenant mean? 2 lives as 1; what's mine is yours, your life is mine; a promise till death do us part
- 4. Give another common example of a covenant. Marriage relationship between husband and wife
- 5. Name one thing that Jonathan did for David. Laid aside his position as heir. Risked his life for his friend. Encouraged his friend. (any 1)





DAVID & GOD'S ARK

- 1. What was the Ark of the Covenant made of? Gold
- 2. What did the Ark of the Covenant represent? God's presence
- 3. Where did David want to bring the Ark to? Back to Jerusalem
- 4. What did David use to transport the Ark on his first attempt? *On a cart, carried by oxen*
- 5. How was the Ark supposed to be carried? On the shoulders of the priests/Levites
- 6. What did David do when the Ark entered Jerusalem? Dance semi-naked
- 7. Who was not happy about David's behaviour? His wife, Michal
- 8. When David's wife reprimanded him for his behaviour, what did David say? *In God's presence, I'll dance all I want!*

DAVID & MEPHIBOSHETH

- 1. Who was Mephibosheth? Jonathan's son. Saul's grandson.
- 2. What was the meaning of the name "Mephibosheth"? "Dead dog"
- 3. What happened to Mephibosheth when he was a little boy? *His nurse dropped him and he became lame in both his feet.*
- 4. Why did David call for Mephibosheth? *Because he remembered his covenant with Jonathan and wanted to show kindness to him for the sake of his father.*
- 5. What benefits was Mephibosheth given? His grandfather's land was restored to him; he ate at the king's table daily; he had servants to work his fields for him









SUMMARY

David was known as a man after God's own heart. Unlike Saul who had no heart for God, David had a whole heart for God.

But more importantly, the life of David reminds us of what Jesus has done for us.

Let's go through this together:

David Anointed:

David was anointed. Jesus is the Anointed One. We are the anointed children of the King!

David & Goliath:

Jesus is bigger than our giants. Jesus has won the victory for us.

David & Saul:

Because of Jesus, we can live like Jesus — knowing that God loves us, protects us and grants us success in what we do.

• David & Jonathan:

Jonathan was David's BFF — He laid aside his kingly position; He risked his life; He encouraged David in time of need.

Jesus is our BFF — He laid aside His kingly position for us; He laid down His life for us; He encourages us in time of need.

David & God's Ark:

Jesus is our reason to celebrate. We can dance like David did!

• David & Mephibosheth:

Mephibosheth enjoyed the benefits of David and Jonathan's covenant. We can enjoy the benefits of God's blessings because of Jesus' New Covenant!
